<u>PERFECT SIMPLE</u> HAD + PP Use for past narrative story) Example: Henry had bought the boat the day before he crashed	<u>SIMPLE</u> Did Didn't Finished in the Past id / t / ed Irregular Verbs. Example: His boat hit an iceberg.	<u>PERFECT SIMPLE</u> Has / have + P.P. Recent Past. Experience. Habit. Example: "His boat has hit an iceberg." Henry has sailed in the Irish Sea before. Henry has always loved sailing.	<u>SIMPLE</u> Do / Does. Don't / Doesn't. Always True. Habitual Action. Example: Henry swims everyday. The ocean is very dangerous.	<u>SIMPLE (Will)</u> Immediate Decision Prediction without evidence. example: I'll shoot a flare. Jane, "Henry will be alright."	<u>PERFECT SIMPLE</u> Will + have + PP The Future in the Past Projections about the future. Example: The Police will have found the boat by now. Jane will have cried herself to sleep.
<u>PERFECT CONTINUOUS.</u> HAD + BEEN + VERB + ING. Example: Henry had been dreaming about Jane when his boat hit the iceberg.	<u>CONTINUOUS</u> was / were + verb + ing. Temporary Action. A specific time period in the past. example: At 3 o'clock Henry was sailing past the lighthouse.	<u>PERFECT CONTINUOUS</u> Have / has + been + verb + ing example: Henry has been swimming for 3 hours. Jane has been crying since the Police told her the news.	<u>CONTINUOUS.</u> BE + VERB + ING. Happening Now. Temporary Activity. example: Henry is swimming to the coast. The Police are looking for Henry. <u>PRESENT TIMETABLE</u> Same as Present Simple example: The Tide comes in at 9.00pm.	<u>Going to + verb.</u> Plans. Arrangements Intentions. Predictions with evidence. example: I'm going to kill the man who told me the boat. I'm going to meet him at 9. I'm going to reach the shore at 7.30pm. <u>CONTINUOUS</u> will + be + verb + ing. example: Jane will be waiting for me.	<u>PERFECT CONTINUOUS.</u> Will + have + been + verb + ing. example: Jane will have been crying for hours.
