PERFECT CONTINUOUS. HAD + BEEN + VERB+ING. Example: Henry had been dreaming about Jane when his boat hit the iceberg.	CONTINUOUS was/were + verb+ing. Temporary Action. At specific time period in the past. Example: At 3 o'clock Henry was sailing past the lighthouse.	PERFECT CONTINUOUS Have / has + been + verb+ing example: Henry has been swimming for 3 hours. Jane has been crying since the police told her the news.	CONTINUOUS BE + VERB + ING. Happening Now. Temporary Activity. example: Henry is swimming to the coast. The police are looking for Henry. PRESENT TIMETABLE same as present simple example: The tide comes in at 9.00pm.	Plans. Arrangements Intentions. Predictions with evidence. Example: I'm going to kill the man who sold me the boat. I'm going to meet him at 9. I'm going to reach the shore at 7.30pm.	PERFECT CONTINUOUS. will+have + been + verb+ing. Example: Jane will have been crying for hours.
